INNOVATE

Innovative research projects have taken CAS researchers all over Asia, from the marshes of Bangkok to the experimental design works at the Shanghai Expo, leading to challenging new perspectives on the diverse problems and accomplishments of Asian cultures.

IMPACT

The Center for Asian Studies is composed of more than 40 UCI faculty members representing five schools and 10 departments across campus who have a specialization in China, Japan, Korea, India and/or Southeast Asia. The center creates opportunities for students, faculty, and the community to explore Asian topics, conduct research in Asia, and develop advanced language skills. CAS sponsors or co-sponsors lectures, cultural programming and community outreach events on campus, and co-sponsors conferences, both at UCI and peer institutions. The annual Kiang Lecture is focused on Chinese politics and economics. The Chew-Liang Chinese Rural Development Research Program is an exchange program focused on the realities and challenges of rural development in China.
