Established in 1983, the Center for Global Peace & Conflict Studies (CGPACS) is a multi-disciplinary center housed in social sciences with faculty and graduate affiliates in eight schools across campus.

CGPACS is dedicated to promoting scholarly, student and public understanding of the military/strategic, economic/environmental, and cultural/normative motives, processes and consequences of both peace and conflict.

The center's mission is to increase the prospects for peace and reduce the likelihood of conflict wherever possible.

INNOVATE

CGPACS explores global problems through multiple lenses, bringing together scholars in disciplines as diverse as political science, the arts, public health, literature, anthropology and others to promote new, cutting-edge research and policy prescriptions.

IMPACT

CGPACS has produced new research on positive and negative inducements in proliferation in the Middle East, Asia, and elsewhere; the economic aspects of globalization and conflict; gender and NGOs; religion and humanitarianism; comparative water policies; transnational gangs; AIDS activism; medicine and public health; and other issues in six of seven continents.

CGPACS sponsors faculty and graduate student research grants, an annual Margolis Lecture, the Humanitarianism in Africa blog and conferences. Since 2006, grantees have produced ten dissertations, 11 books, 48 articles and book chapters, and 10 CGPACS Working Papers; they have also shared research findings at numerous conferences and workshops around the world.
