Mellon Foundation, Hewlett Foundation, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and MacArthur Foundation, as well as numerous other foundations and government agencies.

Research findings from studies carried out by Immigration Center faculty have been cited in the *New York Times*, *Washington Post* and *Los Angeles Times*, as well as presented in special Congressional hearings on immigration issues, thus helping to shape proposals for legislative reform of U.S. immigration law.
