Political science scholars investigate these and other issues that impact our daily lives through legislation, executive decisions, policy changes, court cases, national security initiatives and international laws.

## **INNOVATE**

Studies explore the role citizens play in the development of new democracies, the conditions which create individual moral choices, strategies aimed at halting nuclear proliferation, how democratic nations incorporate new members, and the changing role of private security contracters during times of war.

## IMPACT

Political science internship and outreach programs create hands-on opportunities for students in government, NGOs, law, the private sector and the press at the local, state, national and global levels. Faculty present research at conferences, universities and before governmental entities across the nation and globe; their expert advice is sought by journalists, lawyers and policy makers.

More than 1,000 students annually pursue a major in political science; 90 graduate students are currently studying alongside the department's 29 faculty experts who specialize in American politics, comparative politics, democratization, international relations, political psychology, political theory, public choice, public law, and race and ethnicity.
