## **INNOVATE**

Innovative research focuses on areas of immigration, population, gangs, inequality, social networks, social movements, families, organizations and democracy. Studies explore how employment and incarceration status can change racial perceptions, how career prioritization decisions impact husbands and wives differently, and how social movements can impact democracies.

## **IMPACT**

UCI sociological research findings impact international population policy, design and implementation of the U.S. Census, and development of more effective communication plans for times of crisis.

Nearly 800 undergrads pursue majors in sociology each year and an additional 12,000 enroll in sociology courses. More than 80 graduate students study alongside the department's 28 distinguished faculty in areas of gender issues; virtual worlds; immigration; science, medicine and technology; markets and finance; ethnomusicology; and transnationalism.
