Scholars in the demographic and social analysis program investigate the science of human population. Issues studied include the impact of preschool programs on school readiness, effects of state-mandated insurance for fertility treatment, impacts of minimum drinking age requirements on mortality, influenza mortality in old age, worsening racial/ethnic disparities in California neonatal mortality, and how minimum wage impacts low-skill and young workers.

innovate

Innovative, interdisciplinary research explores the making and unmaking of China's one-child policy, how imprisonment and unemployment color race reporting, handedness and early childhood development, and whether "high-stakes" educational testing promotes economic growth.

impact

Research conducted by DASA scholars has a direct local impact through applied studies which examine key California issues. These studies include an evaluation of California's Safe Routes to School program, research on roadway pollutant exposure at California child care facilities, and a look at how housing vouchers impact immigrants' residential choices.
