What factors shape international relationships? How is political power distributed in democratic and non-democratic societies? What are the best ways to prevent terrorism? How are citizens mobilized to play a greater role in political decision-making? What factors account for change in public policy? Political science scholars investigate these and other issues that impact our daily lives through legislation, executive decisions, policy changes, court cases, national security initiatives and international laws.

investigate

Studies explore the role citizens play in the development of new democracies, the conditions which create individual moral choices, strategies aimed at halting nuclear proliferation, how democratic nations incorporate new members, the changing role of private security contracters during times of war.

innovate

Internship and outreach programs create hands-on opportunities for students in government, NGOs, law, the private sector and the press at the local, state, national and global levels. Over the past five years, faculty have published 35 authored books, 30 edited volumes and more than 200 research articles in peer-reviewed journals. Faculty present research at conferences, universities and before governmental entities across the nation and globe; their expert advice is sought by journalists, lawyers and policy makers.
