Sociology

Sociology studies patterns of relationships among people, how behavior is shaped by these patterns of relationships, and how conflicts and cooperation among groups affect social structure and effect social change. All students are required to complete introductory and core Sociology courses, statistics, theory, and research methods.

Sample Courses: Sociology and Religion, Marriage and Families, Sociology of Age, Medical Sociology

Faculty Research Areas include: work and family of immigrants to the United States, economic changes in Asia, the relation between men and women in different social classes and ethnic groups, attitudes to sexual behavior
