# Department of Chicano/Latino Studies

The DEPARTMENT OF CHICANO/LATINO STUDIES prepares students to function productively in a multiracial and multicultural society.

In the tradition of promoting a critical and interdisciplinary understanding of the histories, politics, social structure and cultures of Chicanos (U.S. residents of Mexican descent or ancestry), Puerto Ricans, Central Americans, South Americans and Caribbean peoples of the United States, the School has recruited nationally recognized scholars with research interests ranging from history and language to sociology, politics, anthropology and public policy. Currently, there are ten core faculty with full or partial appointments in the newly created Department. Within the last two years, this group of scholars have published seven books and dozens of scholarly articles and book chapters; presented at major international conferences; and have been prominently featured as experts on national television programs and in newspapers.

### Other Department honors include:

- Cynthia Feliciano, Assistant Professor, has been named a 2007-08 National Academy of Education/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellow.
- Alejandro Morales, Professor, received the 2007 Luis Leal Award for Distinction in Chicano/Latino Literature;
- Deborah Vargas, Assistant Professor, was named a John Randolph Haynes and Dora Haynes Foundation 2007 Faculty Fellow and was a recipient of the 2007-08 Ford Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowship.

## **Educating for Excellence and Innovation**

Chicano/Latino Studies undergraduates are repeatedly recognized for their academic excellence and service to the campus and community. A number of students complete honors theses each year.
