Social Ecology's unique focus and expertise has made it a leader in applying basic theory and empirical research to address complex societal problems. Since 1970, Social Ecology has grown from a few dozen students to nearly 2,000, with over 18,000 alumni working in fields as disparate as health care, human services, urban planning and law enforcement. The school is made up of three nationally ranked departments and offers four undergraduate degrees, five undergraduate minors, three master's degrees and four doctoral degrees.
